On June 20-22, the Crumhorn Mountain Cowboys, hosted its 2nd annual 3-day CAS event in Maryland, NY. A total of 51 cowpokes attended the event this year. The weather was perfect, the 10 stages were challenging but fun, and the food (all included in the registration fee) was awesome as always. New this year were an Indian trail stage with all the targets set amongst trees in the woods. a new fort (Ft. Redemption), a covered wagon, and some nice Indian teepees (two used on a stage and one set up as a "pee pee teepee" out on the range – too funny!).



Fri. activities included long range and speed side events, a warmup stage, and a delicious all-day BBQ. A breakfast buffet was available Sat. and Sun. mornings. Six main match stages were shot on Sat., followed by a wonderful dinner buffet including cooked-toorder steak, chicken, and all manner of sides and desserts. A great two-piece live band entertained the group afterwards and set a lot of feet to dancing. A roaring bonfire was lit at dusk to finish off the evening. Four more stages were shot on Sun., followed by lunch and the awards ceremony.

SASS World Championship (End of Trail)

The 33rd Annual End of Trail, SASS World Championship, was held at Founders Ranch in Edgewood, NM, June 19-29, 2014.



Prior to the start of the CAS match, the Wild Bunch shooters were busy with their own World Championship. There were special Wild Bunch individual and team side events, warmup stages, and a full 3-day 12-stage Wild Bunch main match. This event continues to grow in popularity, with 83 participants from 18 different states and 4 foreign countries competing this year.



When the WB folks' were done with their competition, it was time for the Cowboy Action Shooters to take over the range for the next 5 days. They, too, had multiple warmup stages and various side events available to help them burn ammo and acclimate to the dry heat, dust, and altitude before the main A total of 517 CAS event. shooters from around the world completed this year's 3-day 12stage CAS main match. The stages were again written by T. A. Chance, and the targets were up close and personal, with uncomplicated acquisitions and "P" traps basically non-existent (resulting in a record 127 clean shooters!). Fast and furious, for There were the usual moving targets, as well as a few pistol and rifle knockdowns, to keep things interesting. Junior boy shooter, Matt Black, set a new EOT record for shooting a stage consisting of 10 rifle, 10 pistol and 2 shotgun in only 9.42 seconds! Try spotting for this guy! Yikes!



There were no major changes or additions to this year's props,

but the "town" had been rearranged somewhat with a different location for the GEM Saloon and the main entertainment stage.



There were plenty of things to keep shooters occupied at the ranch even when not actually slinging lead. Many vendors were on site, although their seemed have number to dwindled even further this year. During the day, there were free stagecoach rides available. longhorn steers to check out (great photo ops), the mounted shooting competition to watch, Gatling guns to shoot, book signings to attend. and shows numerous to see (including Wild West a Medicine Show, exhibition shooter Bill Oglesby, a John Wayne 'live" performance, and musical entertainment provided by the Anslovers). At night, the range hosted various costume contests, poker and blackjack tournaments, a variety show, musical performances, and wild and wooly parties replete with music (even karaoke), dancing, raffles/giveaways, and even free food and beverages. The big Top Gun Shootoff was held just prior to the final awards on Sun., with the top 8 WB men and women and the top 16 CAS men and women battling it out.



As for CAS shooting awards, participants from the Northeast, many attending for the first time, made an impressive showing at EOT this year.
