Mark your calendars now because you won't want to miss out on next month's <u>Annual Magnum PI</u> <u>Match</u>. Attire for the Aug. 18th match is going to be a bit different, with shorts, Hawaiian shirts, and sneakers encouraged (no flip flops or sandals please). We will shoot 3 stages, break for lunch, then shoot the last 3 stages. It's sure to be a fun time!

Also, starting with our August match, we will be making some changes to our monthly RR matches. Below are the basic rules we will go by for these matches in the future:

No more than SIX (6) rounds will be loaded in a pistol magazine at a time.

All handguns will fire .45 ACP from a clip or a magazine.

In addition to the usual SASS WB Traditional and Modern categories, we will also offer an Open category and a Revolver category.

-The Open category will be for a 1911 .45 ACP with a slide that is shorter or longer than what is allowed by SASS for Wild Bunch. No fiber optics or red dot sights allowed.

-The Revolver category will be for a .45 ACP 6-shot revolver. Moon clip fixed or adjustable sights only. No fiber optics or red dots allowed. Any SASS legal, pistol caliber rifle is allowed. Any 1897 or Model 12 in 12, 16 or 20 ga. is allowed.

Reactive rifle targets will be set for factory .38 special 158 gr. bullets.

Reactive handgun targets will be set for SASS Wild Bunch power factor.

Any ideas, comments or criticisms are welcome.
