<u>SASS Pennsylvania State</u> <u>Championship</u>

North Mountain Shootout XVIII, the SASS Pennsylvania State Championship, was held on Memorial Day weekend and hosted once again by El Posse Grande in Muncy Valley, PA. total of 131 shooters А completed the match. The theme this year was "My Heroes Have Always Been Cowboys - A Salute to the USO" with stages dedicated to various USO entertainers from Bob Hope to Gary Sinise and Ann-Margret to Raquel Welch.

SASS Tri-State (MA–CT-RI) Championship

This year's **Tri-State** Championship was once again hosted by the Harvard Ghost Riders, but this year the name changed from was the "Shootout at Sawyer Flats" to "Hellfire at Barrister's Junction" in memory of HGR member Barrister Bill who passed away a few months ago. The event was held in Harvard, MA, on June 2-4, with a total of 114 shooters participating. The theme of this year's match was "Assassins of the Old West" with stages dedicated to the likes of John Wesley Hardin, Curly Bill Brocius, and Tom Horn.

There were numerous speed and accuracy side events on Fri., along with a 3-stage Wild Bunch match and 3 CAS/Plainsman warm-up stages. Six main match stages were shot on Sat. and four on Sun., followed by a Top Gun 3-Person Team Shootout preceding the awards ceremony. The props were good, as always, and the stages were and interesting well-written with plenty of movement and varied target sizes, shapes, and distances

End of Trail, SASS World Championship

The 36th anniversary End of Trail, CAS World Championship, took place at Founder's Ranch in Edgewood, NM, on June 15-25.

Prior to the start of the CAS match, the Wild Bunch shooters were busy with their own World Championship. CKR members, Annabelle Bransford and Rowdy Bill, along with four other "pards" from NY/CT, participated in the WB match for the first time. Temps were high (hitting the 100 degree mark), but continual hydration with bottle after bottle of Gatorade, Propel, and water kept everyone on their feet. The stages were certainly action-packed, with some featuring as many as 30 pistol and 10 shotgun! There were a multitude of knockdowns, a couple of movers, and even one thrower/clay bird. A total 79

shooters completed the 3-day, 12-stage match. Although none of our pards managed to place in their categories (they only went 5 deep), everyone agreed it was a well-written, fun match. Overall Men's and Ladies' WB World Champions were Last Chance Morales and Texas Tiger, respectively.

When the WB folks were done with their competition, it was time for the Cowboy Action Shooters to take over the range for the next several days. There were multiple warmup stages and various side events available to help them get primed for the main event. The heat continued for most of the CAS days, but thankfully, the dust was kept to a minimum, there was a light breeze most of the time, and the little bit of rain that did fall did so outside of shooting hours. A total of 582 CAS shooters from around the world completed this year's 3day, 12-stage CAS main match, down somewhat from last year. The stages were written by Lassiter and Deuce Stevens, and the targets were generally up close and personal, some as close as 8 feet! There were a LOT of shooter's choices. requiring the shooters to use their brains as much as their hands to complete the stages as quickly and efficiently as The stages included possible. some unusual starting positions and a good bit of movement and gun transition. There were also several rifle/pistol knockdowns, a mover, and a swinger that helped keep things interesting.

There were plenty of things to keep shooters occupied at the ranch even when not actually

slinging lead. Many vendors were on site, although their number seemed to have dwindled even further this year. During the day, there were free rides stagecoach available. longhorn steers to check out, the mounted shooting competition to watch, and Gatling guns to shoot. There was also daytime entertainment on some days and various nighttime events throughout the week as well. The Top Gun Shootoffs were held just prior to the final awards on Sun., with the top 8 WB men and women and the top 16 CAS men and women battling it out.

A super big congratulations goes to CKR member. ROWDY BILL, who was awarded a big, beautiful trophy and an awesome custom belt buckle for taking FIRST **PLACE** in the CATTLE **<u>BARON</u>** category. His 21 years of dedication to the sport of CAS finally paid off in a big way – the first New Yorker to ever become World а Champion! Way to go, Rowdy! Well-deserved! And he shot it clean, too, as did his other half, Annabelle Bransford, who didn't do too badly herself, taking home a nice pewter badge for 7th place in the Ladies Senior category. Congrats to both of you! Ya done the CKR proud!
