By splitting the shooters up into 2 posses, the gang was able to complete all 5 stages in a timely fashion and, thankfully, without quite as many misses as last month.

This was the largest RO I course ever held at the Circle K, with 14 new students and 10 refreshers. A total of 6 students attended RO II - 5 new and 1 refresher. Everyone passed with flying colors and was given their new RO pin and 2014 dated chevron.

MUSTER AT FT MISERY

It seems like only yesterday when a meeting was held to discuss the possibility of the CKR hosting the first SASS Wild Bunch State Championship east of the Mississippi, and now suddenly it's all over and in the record books. Where did the time go?

Muster at Fort Misery, held on Memorial Day weekend, was a resounding success, thanks to the efforts of a core group of CKR members. Special thanks go out to Roy Cassidy who served as Match Director, Violet Cassidy who handled registration, Dude Bandit who designed the stages, Lone Star Jake who obtained the shooters badges and trophies, Kay T Ryder who did all the data entry for the scoring, and all the other folks who handled the multitude of tasks required to pull off this event.

Thanks, too, go to the local volunteer fire department/EMTs who were on hand throughout the shoot (and, thankfully, were not needed!), to local Boy Scouts from Troup 54 who served as brass pickers all weekend (a particularly difficult job at any Wild Bunch shoot, less 10 much a stage championship!), and to the vendors who were there to offer their goods and services to the shooters (Lost Target Shooting Supplies, JK Leather, official Match Sponsor Sturm, Ruger & Co.).

The Dude Bandit provided the 39 shooters with 10 fun-filled and undeniably challenging keeping evervone's stages. brain cells and body parts in motion every moment on the range! Each shooter threw a total of 180 rounds of 1911 pistol ammo downrange. only 5 rounds per magazine, that's a lotta mag changes, folks! Of course, the 1897 and Model 12 shotguns and the large caliber rifles got a good workout as well. Rifle and pistol targets ran the gamut those nasty from shaped buzzards and snakes to a huge 24" square, and from various types of movers to every possible kind of knockdown in the book. Shotgun targets from traditional varied knockdowns to double bird throwers. Whee! There were plenty of Shooters' Choices on the stages and some new and different target acquisitions as well. The three posses shot 6 stages on Sat. with a break for lunch and 4 stages on Sun. straight through.

Food throughout the weekend was provided by KF&G club members, Eric and Donna. And a fine job they did! There were delicious breakfast sandwiches and muffins in the morning, burgers and dogs at lunch, and a Sat. night dinner to die for consisting of "cut it with a fork" beef tips, tasty shrimp gumbo, and plenty of sides and homemade desserts.

After everyone had finished their 10 main match stages on Sunday, a 4-person team event was held at Ft. Misery for those who just couldn't get enough of the lead-slinging fun. The event was taken from the movie "The Wild Bunch", with competitors taking on the characters of Tector, Pike, Dutch, and Lyle.

And finally it was time for ceremony. awards First. Smokehouse Dan presented the EMTs with a check for \$1200 for their help throughout the event. He then announced that the Boy Scouts had netted a total of \$295 for their brass picking services, snack sales, and bottle collection during the shoot.
