# NOTES FROM THE TRAIL BOSS

August 19th, just a month before Heluva Rukus 2007! Sixty-three shooters came out to get some practice before the big shoot. The stages this month were from End of Trail 2007. Rowdy Bill hopes that by shooting these stages, some shooters that don't get to travel will get a feel for what they can expect at larger shoots. The stages were challenging with different target acquisitions, but still lots of fun.

We again had cowboys show up for this shoot that haven't been around in a while. It was good to see them all again. Hopefully they will remember how much fun cowboy shooting was, and still is, and want to return all the time. It is important to have some of the older shooters come back to keep the sport moving forward. But I know it is just as important to have all you new shooters.

The SASS motto is "everyone shoots and everyone works". This is the cowboy way. In the Old West, the cowboys on cattle drives depended on each other to share the workload to make life easier for all of them. And when they were done from the drive and in town partying and gambling and doing other activities, they still depended on each other if trouble came to any of them. Well, when we shoot these stages at a shoot, most of them are gunfights that we must get out of. We protect gold, cattle, horses. homestead or loved ones. When a shooter steps up to the line, he or she knows there are cowboys helping them shoot the stage correctly and safely. That is where the working comes in. There is someone at the loading table to make sure that the proper number of bullets and the correct bullets are loaded into each gun. There are three spotters to watch the targets for hits, misses and correct order of shooting. There is the RO who runs the timer, helps the shooter start, and assists the shooter through the stage as safely and as quickly as the shooter wishes to go. Then there is the unloading table officer who insures that all the guns are now empty and safe. We also have target setters who reset the targets properly after each is done. shooter The scorekeeper records the time for each shooter. All this is the working part of Cowboy Action Shooting. This is what makes all of us cowboys and makes this the safest and most fun sport in the world. There are cowboy shooters all over the world that live by the cowboy motto, "Cowboy Up". Everyone shoots - everyone works. We all say thanks for the help at the shoots. But if you still want to see cowboy action continue, you really should get more involved in your local clubs. Take the SASS RO I and RO II classes to better understand range operations and what the RO does for all shooters. Learn about good, safe, fun stage designs and props.

Many shooters just come to shoot and help out at the shoot because that is what they have to do to get through the shoot. But cowboy shooting is so much more than that. Coming out to help at a big shooting event like HR 2007 is the cowboy way. Say at a local shoot "I'll pick brass" or "I'll RO today" or even set targets for a change. Cowboys are a great bunch of people. We enjoy each other's company, and this make the work that we have to do so much easier. Please, the next time you go to a cowboy shoot, ask "Where can I help? ". Don't wait to be asked, or even told. Step up to the plate first.

All cowboys go through a time of nervousness about being in front of people and doing something wrong or getting embarrassed; that is okay. It is normal. But once you get past that, you should take the next step and ask "Where can I help?". You know that it will make you and your cowboy experience better.

Now September 14-15-16 is HR 2007. If you haven't gotten a chance to see this event, please stop by. It is open to all. Bring your family and friends to see the hard work the Circle K puts into the best shoot in the northeast. If you want to help at the shoot, just call Rowdy Bill (518-877-7834) or Smokehouse Dan (518-885-3758). Even if it is only one or two hours, we can always use more help during this time. I know you will be glad you did.

We will have 16 different vendors coming to sell all types of cowboy gear and wears. Bring lots of money! Most of these vendors have donated great prizes, too. But most of all, come out and watch some of
