HELUVA RUKUS 2018

Well, Heluva Rukus 2018 is now in the history books. The Circle K Regulators' 18th annual SASS New York State CAS Championship was once again a tremendous success, thanks to the efforts of many dedicated club members who worked tirelessly to see to it that the shooters were given funfilled, action-packed stages and side events, awesome props, plenty of vendors, unique trophies, overall and an memorable experience on Sept. 14-16, 2018.



Approximately 130 cowpokes participated in the numerous side matches and wandered along sutlers' row on Friday. The side events this year included the usual speed shotgun/rifle/pistol/derringer/ pocket pistol events, three CAS warmup stages, long-range rifle and pistol events, and multiple .22 caliber events. Ruger even had a special area set up where shooters could try out various Ruger firearms for free!



Although the number of vendors was down a bit this year, the 12 vendors on site still proved to be the most at any CAS event north of the Mason-Dixon. Our three main match sponsors, Klassic Laser Works, Cowboy Gunworks, and Sturm, Ruger & Co., were with us throughout the weekend. Other vendors included a leather photographer, bullet maker, makers/ distributors, a custom knifemaker, and vendors selling cowboy clothing and other accessories. A special thanks to Tazz and Rose of Klassic Laser Works for the great CKR / HR 2018 customized first aid kits they donated for every shooter this year – very nice and useful mementos.



The popular Consignment Shop was back again this year, providing shooters with somewhere to display – and hopefully sell - their gently used or no longer needed cowboy clothing and accessories. Sales were brisk, and by the end of the weekend, the tables and clothing racks were nearly empty.



As in 2017, we had unseasonably warm weather for Rukus's main match this year. With temps in the low-mid '80s and a good bit of humidity, it felt more like the June Heluva Rukuses of old. Thank heavens for the cold water the club

provided (and constantly replenished!) on each stage! Although both the shooters and the hard-working Boy Scout brass pickers were pooping out from the heat by the end of the day, we didn't have any casualties due to the weather this year.



As usual, Rowdy Bill did a terrific job with the stages plenty of movement, "shooter's choices", and leadslinging fun. You can never accuse Rowdy of writing boring, stand-anddeliver stages, that's for sure. This year, along with the usual steel targets, shooters were with confronted a mover. several different knock-down and knock-up targets, and, of course, the beloved kick-down door. There was also a nifty new three-tiered target rack made by club member, Sixgun Schwaby. Target sizes, shapes, and distances varied, as did the acquisitions, some of which were relatively simple, while others required a little more thought.






The props were once again some of the best to be found at any CAS match, thanks to the talented CKR building and decorating crews, headed up by Whiskey Brooks and Suggs, Jr. Over the course of the year, the entire Treasure Trove Mine Stage had gotten a major sprucing up/rebuild, and a new "Dynamite Shack" and signage had been added. The Homestead Stage had a new prop as well - a life-size wooden horse built by Yukon Mike. The Train Stage was a favorite among the shooters with its crumbling adobe building front, water tower, "wrecked" engine and dynamite-blasted train tracks. The totally new Army Regiment Stage was very impressive with its numerous canvas pup tents, rifle ammo crates. racks. wagons, canon and limber. Old West scenes and props (including a cattle corral and an Indian village) were set up elsewhere on the club property just to add to the ambiance. All-in-all, there were plenty of great looking props and great shooting stages for everyone to enjoy.



Although attendance was down a bit this year, we still had an impressive number of shooters participate in our main match grand total of а 220, representing 19 states, Canada AND NEW ZEALAND! Yup, we were thrilled to have Powder Burns and Miss D'Meanour. from Tauranga, New Zealand, choose to shoot their first CAS match in the USA with us! Hopefully, they felt it was worth the trip!



Trophies for this year's category winners, both overall and NYS, were certainly unique – metal cowboy silhouettes and engraved leather belt buckles. Pretty cool! Thanks to Lone Star Jake for the ideas and Klassic Laser Works for the execution.



In the end, for the 2nd year in a row, we were pleased to "crown" James Samuel Pike and Spinning Sally as the Overall Top Male and Female and Cartwheel and Spinning Sally as the 2018 New York State Men's and Ladies' Champions, respectively. Awesome shooting, folks!

A couple of CKR members attended this year's Comin' at Cha match, hosted by the world-famous Dooley Gang at the Badlands Bar 3 Ranch in English, TX, on Sept. 25-29. This is one of those SASS matches that needs to be on every shooter's bucket list. It is a blast! 2 ¹/₂ hrs. from Dallas, it is definitely out in the middle of nowhere, but the Dooley Gang knows how to put on a match -AND how to party! Α whopping total of 396 shooters were in attendance this year,

making it one of the largest CAS matches in the country.



It would take pages to list and fully describe the numerous activities went that on throughout the multi-day event, but here they are in a nutshell... In addition to a 12-stage main match (4 stages per day in flights over a 3-day period), there were 4 CAS warmup stages, a 4-stage Wild Bunch mini-match, regular CAS long range and speed side events, a pro-steel side event (using ARs), gun giveaways every hour throughout the main match (total of 24 given away!), motorized mounted shooting (where you shot blanks at balloons as you were driven around an arena in a 4x4), a shoot-n-scoot event (where you shot 20 different rifles, pistols and shotguns as you ran down a 180 ft. boardwalk), a costume contest (this year's categories were based on the 1970's disco era), a treasure hunt (for buried gold and silver Proof coins), and evening dinners and live bands for dancing in the "big barn". Whee! There were a few vendors on site throughout the event as well.



The layout of the range was super, and the props and buildings were great (including a "town" with multiple building fronts, a scaled-down Alamo, and a HUGE wagon). The stages themselves were really fun to shoot with lots of options, gun transition, and interesting targets (including an 8-legged chicken!). Four stages ALL this vear were knockdowns!

The targets were generally big, close, and easily hittable. Acquisitions, however. were oftentimes unusual and sometimes downright mentally challenging (not that that is a bad thing!). There was a fair bit of movement and a lot of gun transition as well. In general, shooters needed to keep both their brains and their bodies fully engaged in each scenario, which is as it should be for a major match in my estimation! Unfortunately, as at most CAS events nowadays, vendors were

a bit lacking, with a mere handful on site. Cowpokes had an opportunity to try their luck at various games of chance at the main clubhouse on Friday night. The awards banquet was held at the nearby American Legion on Saturday night. The food there was tasty and plentiful, drinks were cheap, raffles were abundant, and the awards presentation ran smoothly. The one thing lacking from previous years was a Top Gun Shootoff on Sunday, but this would have been difficult low with the attendance anyway.
